Incoming IAF Chief: In Next War, Hezbollah Will Suffer ‘Unimaginable Blow’

Israel's incoming Air Force commander said Wednesday that in the next war in Lebanon the Hezbollah terror group will suffer the kind of blow "it can't even imagine."

"I have to assume it will happen in my time, and my shoulders already understand the weight of the responsibility," Bar told *Yediot Acharonot*.

Maj. Gen. Tomer Bar will take over as head of the Israeli Air Force from Maj. Gen. Amikam Norkin in April 2022.

He said Hezbollah leader Hassan Nasrallah will "be all" for a no-holds-barred war with Israel.

"He has been waiting for 30 years for that order [from Tehran] and there is no chance he will be absent from such a conflict, with all the force at his disposal. Israel must be prepared."

Bar, who will be tasked with carrying out a strike against Iran's nuclear facilities should one be ordered, understands that he may be required to carry out one of the most complex operations in the country's history.

"I must assume that it might happen during my tenure, and I understand the magnitude of such an order," he said.

"Preparations have been underway for a while, including procurement of the F-35 jets and missile defense systems," Bar said, adding that if such an order is given, "there is no way that I will fly 1,000 kilometers and come home without succeeding in my mission."

When asked about the U.S. refusal to expedite the sale of refueling aircraft despite Israel's request, Bar said the matter has not been finalized and he remained hopeful the necessary aircraft would be supplied early.

Amid Iran nuke talks, Lapid says Israel has capabilities many 'cannot even imagine'

In TV interview, foreign minister vows Jewish state 'will protect itself against the Iranian threat'; promises anyone who misused NSO Group spyware 'will be brought to justice'

Foreign Minister Yair Lapid talked up Israel's military capabilities amid talks between world powers and Iran on restoring the 2015 accord curbing Tehran's nuclear program.

In an interview aired Friday to mark 10 years since he entered politics, Lapid was asked if Israel has the ability to strike uranium enrichment facilities and/or weapons sites in Iran.

“Israel has capabilities, some of which the world, and even some experts in the field, cannot even imagine. And Israel will protect itself against the Iranian threat,” he told Channel 12 news.

He also indicated Israel could attack Iran if necessary without informing the Biden administration, which is looking to rejoin the nuclear deal. Israel vocally opposed the accord, which is formally known as the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action.

“Israel will do whatever it needs to do to protect its security. And we don’t need anybody’s permission for that. That’s been the case since the first day we established this state,” he said.

Lapid also commented on the negotiations being held in Vienna to revive the nuclear deal, from which former president Donald Trump withdrew in 2018. Iran has since ramped up its nuclear activities in violation of the pact.

The foreign minister said there had not yet been a “capitulation” to Iran during the talks, and stressed: “Israel is not against a good deal, it is only against the wrong deal.” He added that Israel has shown information to world powers “that proves the Iranians are lying” about their nuclear activities.

Separately, Lapid was asked about Israeli spyware firm NSO Group, which has faced increasing scrutiny in the wake of allegations that its wares have been used by countries to hack opposition politicians, dissidents, journalists and others.

“The [Israeli] license requirements for NSO and all other such cyberattack firms are simple: You can only use it to prevent terror and to prevent serious crime,” he said.

“If anybody used Pegasus, the core program of NSO, for other purposes, they will be brought to justice, and we won’t hide or cover up anybody,” Lapid added.

During the interview, Lapid also defended the government’s handling of the COVID-19 pandemic, amid accusations of zigzagging in its response to the emergence of the Omicron variant.

“When I compare us to what is happening in France, Germany, the United States, the developed nations, Israel is handling COVID significantly better than the world average,” he said.

“Sometimes you have to respond quickly to changing conditions,” he said of the various policy shifts and restriction changes.

“We’ve not had a single lockdown, we’ve kept the economy open,” he said, referring to the coalition government that took office in June.

Israel’s top diplomat also noted there are currently fewer than 100 serious cases. Lapid was also asked if he believed Bennett would hand over the premiership to him in September 2023, as the two agreed as part of their power-sharing agreement.

“Yes... I have faith in Naftali, yes,” he said

Do Not Despise Prophecies

Perhaps this is a key. Maybe one little sentence tells us much of what we need to know. The key to what, you may ask? The falling away of the church into apostasy.

We know that after years of solid faith, the church began a leftward slant. That devolved into a downhill slope. It resulted in a liberal interpretation of Scripture that questioned just about everything regarding its legitimacy.

Today we have whole denominations pretending they’re Christian, whereas they are anything but that given their beliefs.

Churches on the entire political spectrum have taken up the banner of the world, following its dictates and not the commands of God. It’s a sad state of affairs but foretold in Scripture.

The Lord showed His prophets this would happen, yet the church, through its various institutions of learning, i.e., seminaries and Bible colleges, ignored this truth. These schools turned out pastors who disregarded many Biblical passages because they “weren’t relevant,” they were simply “too hard,” or these church leaders were fearful that hearing certain declarations of God might drive away large donors. In other words, they weren’t faithful to the entire Word of God as Paul says in 2 Timothy 3:16:

“All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness...”

Obviously, in the minds of all these “men of God,” this wasn’t true. There were portions of God’s Word that they had no use for. And what is this? It should come as no surprise: it’s Bible prophecy.

The prophetic Word has always been inconvenient. Israel viewed it as such when the prophets declared her need to reject the allure of pagan gods and the immoral practices they advocated. But, as the Bible tells us, Israel was a stiff-necked people.

They would do what they would do and not let anyone, even their God, tell them it was wrong and that they would regret their poor choices.

In the Church Age, we've not been any different. We've picked and chosen Scripture passages we liked and ignored those we didn't. How wonderful it is to have a God of love! It's not so great that this God is also a righteous judge of sin. Better to ignore those passages that warn of its consequences.

In all these warnings, there is a future that comes with them. It's disturbing, and since we don't want to turn off people who might be seeking the Lord, it's better not to discuss such things. We can attract so many more seekers by telling them that God has a wonderful plan for their lives. He wants to bless everyone regardless of who they are and what they do. No one has to change because that's hard, and conveying that message might hurt people's feelings, which would cause them to leave the church and stop their donations. We simply can't have that. And so it goes.

The church has become the world, a place to have preconceived notions reinforced, where God's truth no longer matters.

What is it that has turned people sour on God through the ages? It's future foretellings, which warn that the present path people are taking is fraught with danger. In other words, again, it's Bible prophecy.

Could this be the reason Paul includes this one little admonition in his letter in 1 Thessalonians 5:20?

“Do not despise prophecies...”

It's the despising of prophecy that has led to incorrect interpretations of Scripture regarding whether or not there is a pre-Tribulation Rapture of the church. Perhaps this idea was too outlandish. Maybe people didn't like that a small segment of believers would be whisked away from earth, while those who didn't practice righteousness as God commanded would be left behind.

The idea certainly became a stumbling block for many, as they convinced themselves it was too deep and mysterious to pursue. Then, of course, there's the issue about money. If believers actually thought Jesus might return soon, what was the point of giving to the church and the work of the Kingdom?

But here's what it always comes down to: God does intend to punish the earth in righteous judgment. And Paul assures us in 1 Thessalonians 5:9 (just as he did in 1 Thessalonians 1:10):

“For God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ...”

The implication here – just as it's explicitly declared elsewhere – is that we must be in Christ to be “worthy” of His deliverance from this world that will soon suffer much for its unbelief.

This is no small thing. It's also why Paul repeats himself in 1 Thessalonians 5:11 (like he also said in 1 Thessalonians 4:18):

“Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing.”

The prophecy of the coming of the Lord before the Tribulation is both warning and encouragement. Without conviction of the pre-Trib Rapture in the hearts of believers, I maintain that they are, by and large, more fearful and less joyful.

After all, if you have no hope of deliverance from the horrible things happening in the world, and you expect to go through the even worse period of the Tribulation, wouldn't that depress you?

But, the dire future for believers that they must endure the most horrible time ever in the history of the planet isn't what God's Word promises.

I, for one, am grateful that He has said that very soon we'll be out of here. That brings me peace and joy in anticipation of this marvelous event.
